Jaca Book had received from Mircea Eliade and Ioan Couliano the tables of contents to write a European thematic edition of the *Encyclopedia of Religion* formerly published by MacMillan.

Eliade and Couliano had maintained the original outlines reorganizing the single independent dictionaries.

Five volumes with cross-references and eleven volumes on religions and cultural areas (plus index).

The European edition (which is currently available in Italian) is edited by Dario M. Cosi, Luigi Saibene and Roberto Scagno.

About the Editor

Mircea Eliade (1907-1986), born in Bucharest, he lived in India between 1928 and 1932. He taught philosophy at the University of Bucharest from 1933 to 1940. Cultural supervisor in London and then in Lisbon, in 1945 he was appointed professor at the École des Hautes Études of Paris. He taught at the Sorbonne and in many European universities. In 1957 he obtained tenure in History of Religion at the University of Chicago, where in 1985 they established the “Mircea Eliade” tenure in his honor.
